In the novel, Dickens' circus is a place for learning through experience; the skilled performers express feats of human endeavour, with each character being sensitive and responsive to their fellow players.

As a group of artists, we too would like to be mindful of our environment, our materials and each other.

For two weeks we are inhabiting a circus space in London's Piccadilly. Sowing, reaping, garnering and through the transformative act of making, we will embrace the circus as a site of spectacle and unfettered fancy. Please join us in unravelling the uncertainties and contradictions held within our own fragile 'Hard Times' . . .
